

## ISC SOFTWARE GUILD MEMBERSHIP AGREEMENT

This Membership Agreement (this “Membership Agreement”) is effective this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2006 (the “Effective Date”) by and between \_\_\_\_\_ a corporation with a principal place of business at \_\_\_\_\_ (“Member”), and the Internet Systems Consortium, a Delaware corporation with its principal place of business at 950 Charter Street, Redwood City, California 94063 (“ISC”), as the sponsor of the ISC Systems Guild (Guild). Numerous entities are or will become members of the Guild by entering into similar Membership Agreements (collectively referred to as “Members”). The purpose of the Guild is to facilitate a closer association between ISC and the vendors and users of ISC’s software.

1. **Enrollment Process.** To become a member of the Guild, an applicant must specify the software product of primary interest by completing the Forum Membership Application Form for that product. The completed application will be attached hereto as Exhibit A (the “Application Form”). ISC shall have the sole discretion to determine whether applicant satisfies ISC’s membership criteria.
2. **Support of the Guild Purposes and Objectives.** While a member of the Guild, Member: (a) agrees to support the purposes and objectives of the Guild and selected Forum, as stated in the Forum Description(s) attached hereto as Exhibit B (the “DHCP Forum Description”); and (b) agrees to participate in good faith in the specified Forum pursuant to the terms hereof.
3. **Member Representative.** Member designates as its representative(s) the individual(s) listed on the Guild Member Contact Form attached hereto as Exhibit C (the “Contact Form”), who shall have the full authority to represent Member in all matters involving the Forum(s) (the “Member Representative”). Only one Member Representative will be listed for each forum. Member shall promptly notify ISC in writing of any change of such designation.
4. **Term.** The term of this Membership Agreement shall commence as of the Effective Date and shall continue thereafter for twelve (12) months, unless terminated earlier as provided herein. The term of this Membership Agreement will automatically renew for successive twelve (12) month periods thereafter, unless either party gives notice of its intent not to renew at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of Member’s then-current membership term.
5. **Dues and Costs.** Guild membership dues (“Dues”) are specified in the Forum Description(s) varying based upon a chosen level of membership category. Member shall pay its first year’s Dues to ISC in full within thirty (30) days of the Effective Date. Dues for the renewal term are due within 30 days of receipt renewal invoice. Renewal invoice will be sent thirty (30) days prior to the end of the current term. Failure to pay constitutes breach of this agreement. Dues are exclusive of taxes or fees, if any, imposed by any governmental entity related to Member’s participation in the Forum. Such taxes or fees shall be Member’s sole responsibility, except for taxes or fees related to the net income of ISC or its personnel. ISC, in its sole discretion, may increase or decrease Dues at any time, provided, that any such Dues changes shall be communicated in writing 60 days prior to the change and shall not affect Member during the remaining period of Member’s then-current membership term. Any payments received by ISC from Member pursuant to this Membership Agreement or any Exhibit hereto shall be applied first to any Dues then payable and then to any other fees or costs then payable, at ISC’s sole discretion.
6. **Termination by Member for Convenience.** Member, in its sole discretion, may at any time terminate this Membership Agreement or any Exhibit mutually executed hereto for convenience. Such termination shall be effective upon receipt by ISC of Member’s written notice of such termination. Such termination shall not excuse Member from paying any remaining Dues for its then-current membership term and shall not entitle Member to a refund of any prepaid Dues. If Member

terminates this Membership Agreement pursuant to this Section 6, all Exhibits hereto also shall be terminated. This Membership Agreement shall not be terminated, however, solely as the result of the termination of any Exhibit.

7. **Termination for Cause.** ISC may terminate this Membership Agreement or any Exhibit mutually executed hereto for material breach by Member. Member may terminate this Membership Agreement or any Exhibit mutually executed hereto for material breach by ISC; such termination shall be effective upon receipt of written notice of breach by ISC, provided that, for material breaches that are capable of cure, ISC shall be permitted sixty (60) days to cure after receiving written notice describing such breach. If either party terminates this Membership Agreement pursuant to this Section 7, all Exhibits hereto also shall be terminated. This Membership Agreement shall not be terminated, however, solely as the result of the termination of any Exhibit.
8. **Other Termination.** This Membership Agreement, including all Exhibits hereto, shall terminate upon receipt of written notice (i) if Member or ISC is dissolved or liquidated or (ii) if either party files or has filed against it a petition in bankruptcy that it is not contesting in good faith, has a receiver appointed to handle its assets or affairs and it is not contesting such appointment in good faith, or makes or attempts to make an assignment for the benefit of creditors
9. **Confidential Information.** Information that ISC does not wish to become public shall be marked or otherwise identified as “Confidential Information” at the time of disclosure to Member. Upon termination of this Membership Agreement, Member shall return or destroy all of ISC’s Confidential Information. Member also shall provide ISC with a written document signed by Member’s authorized representative certifying that Member has complied with this obligation. With respect to a Member’s receipt of Confidential Information, for two (2) years after the date of receipt, Member will use: (i) the same care and discretion to avoid disclosure of such Confidential Information as the Member uses with its own similar information that it does not wish to disclose, and, in any event, no less than a reasonable degree of care; and (ii) such Confidential Information for any lawful purpose in accordance with restrictive markings provided for herein.
10. **Exceptions.** Member may disclose Confidential Information subject to a restrictive marking to: (i) its employees that have a need to know; (ii) any other party with ISC’s prior written consent. Member may disclose Confidential Information to the extent required by law, but must give ISC reasonable prior notice to allow ISC a reasonable opportunity to obtain a protective order. No obligation under this Membership Agreement will apply to Confidential Information that is: i) already rightfully in Member’s possession at the time it is received or thereafter is rightfully received by Member without a nondisclosure obligation; ii) developed independently by Member; iii) publicly available when received, or thereafter becomes publicly available through no fault of the Member; or iv) disclosed by ISC to a third party without a nondisclosure obligation.
11. **Intellectual Property Policy Statement.** Member agrees to abide by the Guild’s Intellectual Property Policy Statement attached hereto as Exhibit D.
12. **Security Information.** ISC and Member may agree to enter into the Advance Security Notification Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit E, under which Member shall qualify to receive notifications of known security vulnerabilities based upon selected Forum participation up to ten (10) days before ISC releases such information through the CERT® Coordination Center (“CERT/CC”).
13. **Member Warranties and Representations.** Member warrants and represents that it has authority to enter into this Membership Agreement and that it has not and will not make any representations and warranties for or on behalf of ISC.
14. **Disclaimer of Warranties.** ALL INFORMATION, SERVICES, GOODS, AND SOFTWARE, IF ANY, PROVIDED TO ANY MEMBER UNDER ITS MEMBERSHIP AGREEMENT BY ISC DIRECTLY OR THROUGH ISC IS PROVIDED SOLELY ON AN “AS-IS” BASIS, WITHOUT WARRANTY OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, NONINTERFERENCE AND NON-INFRINGEMENT.

15. **Limitation of Liability.** IN NO EVENT SHALL ISC BE LIABLE FOR INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES (INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION LOST PROFITS) EVEN IF ISC HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. IN NO EVENT SHALL ISC'S LIABILITY TO MEMBER, WHETHER IN CONTRACT, TORT, OR OTHERWISE FOR ANY DIRECT LOSS, DAMAGE, INJURY, COST OR EXPENSE, HOWEVER ARISING, AND OF WHATEVER NATURE EXCEED THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF DUES PAID (OR DUE IF NOT PAID) BY MEMBER IN THE TWELVE (12) MONTHS PRIOR TO THE ACCRUAL OF THE CLAIM.
16. **Publicity and Promotion.** ISC may include Member's name in press releases, website or other collateral related to the Guild after ISC executes this Membership Agreement. ISC will seek specific approval for any use of Member name beyond a listing with other members. Member may utilize DHCP Forum logo pursuant to ISC's logo guidelines to be furnished upon request.
17. **Compliance with Laws.** Each party shall use reasonable efforts to comply with laws of all applicable jurisdictions, insofar as they relate to performance under this Membership Agreement.
18. **Assignment.** Member may not assign this Membership Agreement, or its rights and obligations hereunder, without the prior written consent of ISC. Any attempted assignment without the prior written consent of ISC is void. This Membership Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the parties and their permitted successors and permitted assigns.
19. **Personnel.** Each party is responsible for the supervision, direction, and control of its respective personnel.
20. **No Agency.** This Membership Agreement does not create an agency, joint venture, or partnership between the parties. Neither party is authorized to make any representation or commitment on behalf of the other party without its prior written consent.
21. **Notice.** Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Membership Agreement to ISC shall be given in writing and shall be (a) sent by electronic mail and (b) hand delivered, faxed, sent by certified or registered mail or overnight courier service to:

23. **Interpretation; Venue; Miscellaneous.** This Membership Agreement will be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California, without regard to its principles of conflict of law or choice of laws. The parties expressly agree that the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods shall not apply to this Membership Agreement. All disputes arising out of this Membership Agreement shall be resolved by arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Commercial Arbitration Rules and judgment on the award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof or over the applicable party or its assets. The seat of any such arbitration will be in Redwood City, California. Provided, however, that since breach of the confidentiality provisions of this Membership Agreement will cause ISC irreparable harm for which an award of damages is insufficient, the parties agree that ISC has the

right to apply to any court of law or equity of competent jurisdiction for appropriate injunctive or other interim or provisional relief pending ultimate resolution of the dispute. Neither party will bring a legal action related to this Membership Agreement more than two (2) years after the cause of action accrued. This Membership Agreement does not create, and shall not be construed as creating, any rights enforceable by any person not a party to this Membership Agreement. The headings of the Sections contained in this Membership Agreement are inserted for convenience of reference only and are not intended to be a part of or to affect the meaning or interpretation of this Membership Agreement. If any provision in this Membership Agreement is found to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable to any extent, the parties shall endeavor in good faith to amend this Membership Agreement to preserve its intention. If the parties fail to agree on such an amendment, such invalid provision will be enforced to the maximum extent permitted by law or, if not enforceable, will be severed from the remaining terms, conditions and provisions, which will remain in full force and effect.

- 24. **Waiver.** No waiver or amendment of any of the provisions of this Membership Agreement shall be binding unless made in writing and signed by the parties. No failure on the part of either party to exercise, or delay in exercising, any right or remedy hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof, nor shall any single or partial exercise of any such right or remedy by such party preclude any other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right or remedy. A waiver on one occasion shall not constitute a waiver on any further occasion.
- 25. **Survival.** The provisions of Sections 5 (as to accrued but unpaid Dues), 9 (Confidential Information), 10 (Exceptions), 11 (Intellectual Property Policy Statement), 15 (Limitation of Liability), 23 (Interpretation; Venue; Miscellaneous), and 25 (Survival) shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Membership Agreement.
- 26. **Entire Agreement.** The provisions of this Membership Agreement and all Exhibits hereto constitute the entire agreement between the parties and supersede all prior agreements and understandings relating to the subject matter hereof. No modification or any claimed waiver of any of the provisions hereof shall be binding unless in writing and signed both parties.
- 27. **Counterparts.** This Membership Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if all parties hereto had signed the same document. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute one instrument.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, ISC and Member have executed this Membership Agreement as of the Effective Date.

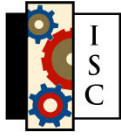

### **DHCP FORUM DESCRIPTION**

#### **Background and Purpose**

The DHCP Forum (the “Forum”) is a project created and sponsored by the Internet Systems Consortium (“ISC”) as a part of its Software Guild to help fund development and maintenance DHCP and to guide its feature set. ISC is committed to providing development of DHCP and enhancements as funding permits. ISC funds all DHCP programming efforts with donations, grants and membership dues. Members of DHCP Forum are ensuring the continued development and maintenance of DHCP. ISC’s “to do” list currently includes: improved failover protocol support, complete IPv6 support, securing the DHCP protocol and continued maintenance of the code.

As the Forum sponsor, ISC is responsible for administering the Forum’s membership system, for coordinating inputs to the DHCP Technology, and for promoting the DHCP Forum as the means to debug and enhance the DHCP Technology continually.

#### **Membership levels and Benefits**

Forum members choose the level of participation best suited to their business goals from multiple membership categories. The categories and related benefits are described below.

- **Individual Direct notification of patches.** Via email, notifications will be sent out as soon as patches become available with direct link for download.
- **Invitation to DHCP Developers Meeting.** Annual meeting for all DHCP Forum members to discuss DHCP roadmap and other topical issues. These meetings will generally be held in conjunction with a more general industry meeting. Travel expenses are the responsibility of the member.
- **Periodic Newsletter.** Newsletter focus will include DHCP version status updates, protocol updates and other news.
- **Forum style mailing list.** All members are invited to participate in open discussion of DHCP related issues and questions. ISC staff will participate to address questions and provide tips. Direct email to ISC staff for specific questions containing confidential information.
- **Priority bug fixes.** Bug reports submitted by Forum members will be addressed in advance of other bug reports, excluding security vulnerabilities.
- **Early security vulnerability Bulletins.** Based upon membership levels, DHCP Forum members will receive notification of known DHCP security vulnerabilities up to 10 days prior to the release of such information through CERT. This information is released under NDA and requires a PGP key.
- **Read only access to the DHCP source tree repository.** Source tree access is available via SSH or CVSweb to DHCP Forum members based upon membership level.
- **Training events.** DHCP FORUM members have access periodic training event sponsored by ISC. Topics include implementation and upgrade tips, debugging tactics and special interest topics such as integration, protocol changes and DNS SEC. Training events will be held in conjunction with Forum meeting or other industry conferences. Travel expenses are the responsibility of the member. These events may also be open to the public for a fee based upon space availability.
- **Engineering support.** ISC engineers will address questions posed by DHCP FORUM members dealing with complex problems or integration issues for member’s product or own internal network. This benefit is limited to OEM and Patron level members. Coverage is on a 9x5 basis (9am-5pmET).
- **Access to pre-release version of DHCP software during final testing.** Access to DHCP software will be provided to OEM and Patron members during final testing prior to general public availability. Security patches and general bug releases are excluded from the early release program.

- **Feature priority planning.** All members are invited to attend the DHCP Developers Forum meeting. Further discussion and prioritization of proposed features will be continued at this meeting. Much of the discussion will focus on implementation issues and compatibility.
- **Discounted custom development fees.** ISC currently does custom code development. Forum members will be offered a discounted rate for special project assuming subsequent contribution to open source distribution.
- **3<sup>rd</sup> line Support for enduser customer queries.** Optional service intended to help OEM members in supporting their customer base.

#### **DHCP Forum Operations and Rules of Procedure**

The DHCP Forum will operate under Rules of Procedure that are issued by ISC and amended from time to time as needed to address the evolving needs of the Forum.

#### **DHCP Forum Intellectual Property Policy Statement**

All Members of the DHCP Forum must abide by the Forum's Intellectual Property Policy Statement. Failure to do so is grounds for termination of Member status.

### **Security**

ISC works with root and TLD nameserver operators in order to provide sufficient time to investigate the breaches and to issue any necessary patches before general disclosure to the Internet community. ISC coordinates the release of security-critical information with the CERT<sup>®</sup> Coordination Center ("CERT/CC"), in its capacity as a member of the Forum. Forum Members may qualify to receive advance notifications of security vulnerabilities up to ten (10) days before ISC releases such information through CERT/CC by also entering into an Advance Security Notification Agreement with ISC.

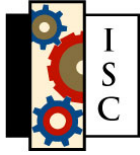

**INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY POLICY STATEMENT**

**Background**

The DHCP (“Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol”) Technology is Open-Source Software (“OSS”) that is available to the public in source code form without the licensing restrictions that would normally be attendant with proprietary software. DHCP is one of a number of mission critical components of the Internet that are open source, like Apache web server, BIND, and InterNetNews (“INN”). In the OSS model, users of the DHCP Technology also act as its co-developers, which fosters rapid code improvement, effective debugging, and development of features and functions of most use to the user community.

**No Claim of Rights**

Neither ISC nor any Member of the Forum, nor any other developer making contributions to the ISC implementation of the DHCP Technology, has any ownership claim or intellectual property rights (patents, trade secrets, or copyright) in the ISC implementation of the DHCP Technology. No Member inputs, comments, or communications with or through the DHCP Forum and its other Members related to the ISC implementation of the DHCP Technology shall be claimed as confidential or proprietary information of that Member. No Member shall demand or accept any license fee, royalty, or other such “right to use” compensation from any other Member for access to the ISC implementation of the DHCP Technology. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing, no obligation under this Intellectual Property Policy Statement will apply to any work which is created by Member and which is based on or incorporates the DHCP Technology, including but not limited to translations, abridgments, condensations, improvements, updates, enhancements, or any other form in which the DHCP Technology may be recast, transformed, adapted, or revised.

**Non-Interference**

No Member shall interfere with the rights of any third party to use the DHCP Technology when being used in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Forum’s Membership Agreement and this Intellectual Property Policy Statement.
